10-Feb-26: Flight to Saigon/Vietnam

Individual trip to Munich Airport and flight to Southern Vietnam.

11-Feb-26: Arrival Ho Chi Minh City (B/-/-)

Be greeted upon arrival then transfer approx. 30 mins (8 km) from Ho Chi Minh City Airport to central Ho Chi Minh City in the comfort of a private, air conditioned vehicle with a private driver.

Early Check In with breakfast included.

Rest of the day for leisure to relax and akklimatise and do the first walks around your hotelarea.

Overnight in Saigon.

12-Feb-26: Enjoy the Mekong Delta – Cai Be – Can Tho (B/L/-)

A Day in Cai Be

Today's tour will begin at 08:00. Leave the busy streets of Ho Chi Minh City and drive 2 hours to the Mekong Delta.

Upon arriving in Cai Be, board a private boat and start exploring the Delta. Savor the taste of locally grown fresh fruits, relish the refreshing breeze while the boat glides through the river.

Go ashore and stroll through a local village and flourishing fruit gardens. From here, take a sampan through the narrow canals around the island, appreciating the tranquility and lush landscapes of this part of the Delta.

Next, explore the local culture by visiting families who specialize in handicraft products. It's a unique opportunity to witness traditional techniques and learn about the cultural significance of these crafts.

Leaving the serene island, the boat takes on a brief journey along a busy area. The river banks bustle with various businesses, while local boats dot the middle of the river, creating a vibrant and bustling atmosphere.

Stop at small family-run workshops making local specialties such as rice popcorn and coconut candy before arriving at a house that has been lived in by more than four generations and is a great example of traditional 'Mandarin' architecture. A delicious home-cooked Vietnamese meal will be served for lunch here. Then, take a walk through their fruit orchard to see the fresh seasonal fruits on the trees.

Late afternoon, continue by vehicle to Can Tho, the largest city in this area and the fourth largest city in Vietnam. The name of the city, which means 'river of poems' in Vietnamese, refers to its location in the Mekong Delta region.

Overnight in Can Tho.

13-Feb-26: Can Tho – Cai Rang Floating Market (B/-/-)

Start the day early with a boat ride to Cai Rang, once the largest floating market in the Mekong Delta. The waterway of boats, both tourists and traders can be seen, although some days there are few traders (due to time of year/demand). See local produce depending on the season for sale - mango, bananas, papaya, pineapple, and even floating coffee sellers and noodle soup vendors. Here boats laden with fruit and vegetables, with the vendors jostling for the best positions on the river.

Move to the meeting point (Ba Lang - Boat station) for biking.

Cycle along the village road, observe the daily activities of the locals in the countryside, along the two sides of the path through canals, orchards (papaya, jackfruit, orange, ect), bananas, vegetable fields.....

You will have the opportunity to see a natural tree with a lifespan of over 100 years and has been recorded as a Vietnamese heritage tree.

The place where you are going to the house of very friendly family who will invite you to "welcome drink".

Rest of the day at leisure.

Overnight in Can Tho.

14-Feb-26: Can Tho – Chau Doc (B/-/-)

After breakfast depart for the 3-hour drive to Chau Doc.

This afternoon visit Sam Mountain, an important pilgrimage site that is frequently visited by pilgrims from all over the Mekong Delta. There are dozens of pagodas and temples around Sam Mountain and reaching the peak is the highlight of the visit. The views from the top are spectacular (weather permitting) and you can easily look out over Cambodia.

Overnight in Chau Doc.

15-Feb-26: Chau Doc - Ho Chi Minh City (B/-/-)

After breakfast, visit Chau Doc's local market which overlooks the confluence of three rivers, and later take a boat to Chau Giang District where a tiny mosque serves the local Cham community.

The Cham minority who dominated coastal Vietnam from the 2nd to the 9th centuries were originally Hindu, but became Muslim as a result of contact with Arab seafarers and merchants in the Middle Ages. In Southeast Asia Islam was disseminated primarily by merchants who, following the monsoon winds, lived in various coastal towns for months at a time. The Chams also practise silk weaving and you may have the opportunity to see them at work. The architecture here is rather distinctive.

Then, visit a beautiful Muslim mosque, and later visit the floating houses that double as catfish farms, now a huge industry for the country.

Return to Saigon in the afternoon. Overnight in Saigon.

16-Feb-26: Ho Chi Minh City (B/-/-)

Transfer Ms. Z. (daughter) from airport to the hotel.

Day at leisure. Overnight in Saigon.

17-Feb-26: Ho Chi Minh City – Today is Tet-Holiday (Lunar New Year) (B/-/-)

This morning meet the local guide and start with a walking tour (depending on the season, this order might be changed) through the historic city center and Central Business District. See the architecturally splendid City Hall, historic Dong Khoi Street, the Continental Hotel and the Saigon Opera House.

During Tet holiday, it transforms into a spectacular Flower Street, filled with vibrant blossoms and creative Nguyen Hue Walking Street zodiac-themed displays, where locals and visitors celebrate, take photos, and enjoy the joyful spirit of Lunar New Year.

Continue on foot to the Central Post Office. Here, you can also glimpse the former CIA building, where one of the last helicopter evacuations took place in 1975.

Note: Notre Dame Cathedral will be undergoing restoration until approximately April 2027. Please note that during this time, you will not be able to enter the cathedral in order to avoid endangering the construction work and your own safety. You can view the cathedral from the outside.

Stroll through lovely 30 April Park to perhaps the city's most famous landmark - the Reunification Palace. Now preserved in a time warp, the 'war rooms' in the basement plus the opulent display's are fascinating.

Next choose one from these two options:

The War Remnants Museum, which exhibits artifacts and photographs relating to the country's wars

OR

The History Museum of Ho Chi Minh City showcases Vietnam's rich cultural heritage through artifacts spanning from prehistoric times to the Nguyen dynasty. Its elegant 1929 French-Asian style building offers visitors a journey through centuries of history, art, and tradition.

Overnight in Saigon.

18-Feb-26 : Ho Chi Minh City – Phu Quoc (B/-/-)

Transfer approx. 30 mins (8 km) from central Ho Chi Minh City to Ho Chi Minh City Airport in the comfort of a private, air conditioned vehicle with a private driver and a guide for your flight to Phu Quoc Island.

Upon arrival in Phu Quoc, transfer without guide to hotel in a private vehicle.

Overnight in Phu Quoc.

19-Feb to 21-Feb-26: Phu Quoc Beachstay (B/-/-)

Die Tage stehen zur freien Verfügung für den Strandaufenthalt und eigene Entdeckungen.

Entdecken Sie die Insel, die wegen ihrer weißen Sandstrände auch Perleninsel genannt wird. Besuchen Sie z.B. die verschiedenen Strandregionen sowie den Bai Sao Strand mit seinem puderweißen Strand an der Süd-Ost-Küste. Wassersport wird an diversen Strandabschnitten angeboten; zum Schnorcheln und Tauchen geht es zu den benachbarten kleineren Inseln. Genießen Sie einen faszinierenden Blick über die Inseln bei einer Fahrt mit der Seilbahn Hon Tom. Die Gondelbahn verbindet die Insel Phu Quoc mit der Insel Hon Thom im Golf von Thailand in Vietnam.

Im Hauptort Duong Dong erleben Sie den südvietnamesischen Lebensstil mit dem täglichen Markt und Fischmarkt. Tauchen Sie am Abend ein in den Nachtmarkt mit seinen Essensständen und naschen Sie verschiedene vietnamesische Köstlichkeiten.

Übernachtung auf Phu Quoc.

22-Feb-26: Phu Quoc – Danang – Hoi An (B/-/-)

Transfer without guide from hotel to Phu Quoc airport in a private vehicle.

Be greeted upon arrival then transfer approx. 50 mins from Da Nang Airport to Central Hoi An in the comfort of a private, air conditioned vehicle with a private driver and a guide.

Visiting Cham Museum on the way; browsing the remarkable collection of Cham sculptures and artefacts dating from the 7th to 15th century.

Overnight in Hoi An.

23-Feb-26: Tranquil Hoi An: Community & Nature (B/-/-)

Depart the hotel at 08:30 for a half day adventure in a quaint village located 30-minutes drive west of Hoi An. Start the tour with a visit to a multi generational family home, offering a glimpse into their traditional lifestyle and their organic garden. Then, hop on a bicycle for a leisurely 40-minute ride, explore the surrounding countryside by bicycle, passing through villages, rice fields (seasonal), local homes and temples.

Arrive at the banks of the Thu Bon River for a short boat cruise to a bamboo bridge, a crucial crossing for farmers to access their fields. Continue through plantations of peanuts (seasonal), chillis, fresh herbs and other produce, observing farmers at work. On the cycle back, visit a family home and witness the craftsmanship of a local woodshop.

Once back at the home of your hosts, experience a fun hands-on bánh xèo (savory pancake) demonstration, followed by a farm fresh meal featuring organic produce from the garden, offering a taste of authentic Vietnamese flavors. This experience provides an opportunity to observe sustainable farming practices and rural community life in Central Vietnam.

Back to Hoi An at noon and exploring Hoi An Old Town, learning all about its illustrious past as a trading port. Take a walk through town, seeing remarkably well-preserved traditional houses that have withstood hundreds of years of weather and war.

Make a stop at the Japanese Bridge, one of two such bridges in Vietnam. The bridge spans a small waterway and was built more than 400 years ago to connect the Japanese community with the Chinese who lived on the other side of the water. Admire the carvings and paintings inside the bridge, learning about their symbolism and cultural significance.

Continue to a Chinese communal hall, a colorful mélange of bright gates, dragon statues and elaborate rooftops. Get an introduction to ancestor worship while visiting the family altar and watching local devotees making offerings.

Explore smaller laneways and local neighborhoods, gaining a better appreciation of Hoi An's endless charm. After this insightful glimpse of Hoi An, return to the hotel or your next destination.

Overnight in Hoi An.

24-Feb-26: Hoi An free (B/-/-)

All day at leisure. Overnight in Hoi An.

25-Feb-26: Hoi An – Hai Van Pass – Trekking in Bach Ma National Park – Hue (B/-/-)

Transfer approx. 3 hrs via Hai Van Pass from Hoi An to Hué.

On the way visit Bach Ma National Park and enjoy a panoramic view of the valley. Some stretches may be challenging but during the hike, you will enjoy the beautiful scenery, the pristine waterfalls and opportunities to observe the local flora and fauna.

(Prefer five lakes waterfall route – medium level)

Arriving in Hue in the late afternoon. Overnight in Hue.

26-Feb-26: Hué - Thanh Tien – Imperial Citadel – Thuy Xuan incense village – Emperor Tombs (B/-/-)

Today heading to the countryside to Thanh Tien. For hundreds of years the residents of this village have made beautiful paper flowers including chrysanthemums, orchids and lotus designs. Witness the locals crafting these delicate creations and learn about their role in traditional Vietnamese culture.

Next stop is the UNESCO-heritage listed Imperial Citadel. Roam the expansive grounds, hearing stories of the majestic buildings, including Kien Trung Palace, once the residence of Vietnam's last emperors, which has been superbly renovated by the local conservation department in recent years.

Leave the city behind and travel through Hue's outskirts. On the way, passing by the incense making village Thuy Xuan, noticeable with colorful bouquets of incense. Heading to the tomb of Emperor Minh Mang, a Nguyen Dynasty ruler known for his opposition to French occupation and his decadent lifestyle. Explore his remarkable tomb, admiring the imposing architecture and gorgeous forest setting while learning more on this historic figure.

Continue to Emperor Khai Dinh's tomb, which is equally impressive, yet a completely different complex. See the blend of traditional Vietnamese design with European influence, making it unique from other royal tombs in Hué.

Returning to the hotel. Overnight in Hué.

27-Feb-26: Hué City – Hanoi (B/-/-)

Morning at leisure.

Today afternoon visit Thien Mu Pagoda, perhaps Hue's most iconic landmark located along the beautifully named Perfume River. Apart from the spiritual aspect and sweeping view, the vintage vehicle on display offers an interesting story. After the short boat ride along the Huong river, continue to An Dinh Palace, the former private residence of several Nguyen Dynasty emperors. Built in 1917 and decorated with both Roman-style motifs and traditional Vietnamese motifs, the former palace offers a reminder of the power and wealth of the emperors, as well as the turbulent history of Vietnam in the 20th century.

Transfer to Phu Bai airport for the evening flight to Hanoi.

Suggested flight Hue – Hanoi / VN 1544 / 18:20 - 19:40

Be greeted upon arrival then transfer approx. 50 mins (35 km) from Noi Bai Airport to central Hanoi in the comfort of a private, air conditioned vehicle with a private driver.

Overnight in Hanoi.

28-Feb-26: Hanoi – Ninh Binh – Biketour (B/-/-)

In the late morning transfer approx. 2 hours from central Hanoi to Ninh Binh.

After the lunch (at own expense) join the guide for an in-depth exploration of the ruins of Vietnam's first capital. Learn about the Dinh (968-980) and Le (980-1009) Dynasties and about the history of the site. See ancient tombs and the ruins of the once-imposing Citadel.

A scenic bike ride around the villages, alongside rice fields nestled amidst limestone mountains. Along the way, stop at Thai Vi Temple, set in a picturesque valley - a peaceful spot dedicated to the Tran dynasty kings.

For those wanting to extend the ride, continue 7-10 km (45-60 minutes) to Bich Dong Pagoda where an ascent of 200 steps leads to Ngu Nhac Mountain. This path unveils three cave pagodas dating back to 1428, revealing captivating views over the countryside. (Note: This extension includes approximately 1 km of biking along roads where vehicle traffic can be busy.)

Return to hotel and overnight in Ninh Binh.

01-Mar-26: Ninh Binh – Mua Cave - Trang An (B/-/-)

This morning climbing approximately 500 stone steps to Mua Cave and enjoy a breathtaking panoramic view of the landscape and the Ngo Dong River.

Reach Trang An eco tourism area. Board a private sampan for a journey through the Sao Khe river. Limestone hills surround a peaceful river which passes through a series of caves. The calm and peaceful river is filled with the sounds of chirping birds and the gentle splashing of oars.

Return to hotel overnight in Ninh Binh.

02-Mar-26: Ninh Binh – Cuc Phuong National Park – Ninh Binh (B/-/-)

Today visit a Bear Sanctuary established by Four Paws, the global animal welfare organization for animals. The sanctuary is not only a new home to bears rescued from bile farming and the illegal wildlife trade in Vietnam, but an unforgettable experience for learning and exploring in a natural setting.

Follow the representative of the center to explore the bear kitchen, vet clinic and bear houses where rehabilitation processes and bear healthcare happens. The tour guide will share bear stories and give insightful information about the bears.

Continue to Cuc Phuong National Park to visit a second conservation center, the Endangered Primate Rescue Center where some of the rarest primate species in Asia including langurs and gibbons can be seen (primates are not always active during the hotter parts of the day).

More wildlife discovery at the Carnivore and Pangolin Education Centre. The current permanent resident animals include Pangolin, Binturong, Mask Palm Civet, Leopard Cat, Owston's Civet, and Common Palm Civet. Listen to their rescue stories and find out why they sadly cannot return to the wild.

Continue further into Cuc Phuong National and visit the 'Cave of Prehistoric Man', where human skeletons and stone tools dated to some 7.500 years old have been found. Overnight in Ninh Binh.

03-Mar-26: Ninh Binh – Bai Tu Long Bay (B/L/D)

Transfer 4 hours to Halong for an overnight cruise in Bai Tu Long Bay.

After the welcome onboard and checking into the cabin, lunch will be served whilst cruising. In the afternoon, enjoy some visits or activities (depending on the boat's set itinerary). Towards the end of the afternoon the boat will anchor for the night surrounded by karst formations.

Enjoy sunset on the deck followed by dinner, then retire for the evening.
Overnight on board.

04-Mar-26: Bai Tu Long Bay – Hanoi – Water Puppet Theater (B/-/-)

Wake up to the fresh morning amidst the bay and have breakfast (brunch on some boats) while leisurely immersing in the serene setting of the spectacular rock formations. Proceed to checkout as the cruise arrives towards port. Transfer back to Hanoi with the shuttle bus of your cruise. Check-In at hotel in Hanoi.

In the evening being escorted by guide and drive to experience the ancient art of water puppetry at the famed Water Puppet Theater. Overnight in Hanoi.

05-Mar-26: Discover Hanoi (B/-/-)

Today's full day discovery of Hanoi starts at 08:30. Begin with a visit to the sixth-century Tran Quoc Buddhist Pagoda, on the shores of serene West Lake.

Next, take a short drive to visit the famed Temple of Literature. In 1076 Quoc Tu Giam - Vietnam's first university, also referred to as Van Mieu, was established within a temple to educate Vietnam's royalty, mandarins and members of the elite, for an incredible 800-years.

Following, chose a museum option (to be discussed on the actual day of the tour):

Option 1: Vietnam Women's Museum. Highly acclaimed, the museum displays highlights of Vietnam's vast cultural diversity and the significant role women play in Vietnamese society.

Option 2: The Vietnam Museum of Ethnology (closed Mondays) is a must-visit for anyone interested in learning about the rich cultural diversity of Vietnam. The museum houses a vast collection of interactive exhibits that showcase the 54 ethnic groups of Vietnam.

In the afternoon, visit Hanoi's iconic Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum complex. The site is fascinating yet expect long walking distances (Note the Mausoleum is closed Monday and Fridays, each afternoon as well as annually from June 12th to Aug 14th).

Continuing on foot past the Mausoleum (viewed from outside) to learn about the life and legacy of the nation's founder. Continue to the 'house on stilts' where 'Bac Ho' resided from 1958 to 1969 (closed on Monday and Friday). Stroll around the tranquil grounds before completing the circuit at the One Pillar pagoda; built in 1049, the symbol of Hanoi is a unique representation of the city.

Mid-late afternoon, continue the exploration with a stroll through Hanoi's Old Quarter. A maze of alleyways and hidden treasures, learn about local life in the '36-guilds' as you weave through the frenetic streets on foot. Overnight in Hanoi.

06-Mar-26: Hanoi – Khau Pha Pass – Mu Cang Chai (B/L/-)

This morning, depart Hanoi for the 4.5-hour drive to Nghia Lo in Yen Bai Province. Here, mountains are shaped like masterpieces, by majestic and sometimes vertiginous rice terraces classified as national heritage inhabited by hill tribe groups.

En-route, stop for a short break. Reach Nghia Lo midday and have lunch in a Black Thai hill tribe village, nestled in the fertile valley of Muong Lo, a major rice growing region.

After the meal, enjoy a short walk to discover peaceful hamlets inhabited by different hill tribe groups. Characterised by typical traditional houses on stilts, this village offers a succession of rice fields where the locals can be seen working with their buffaloes or other livestock and farm scenes.

Late afternoon, transfer 2.5-hours along a mountain pass – well known as the 'road for photographers' with photogenic rice and tea plantations lining the steep slopes of the mountain to Mu Cang Chai.

Upon arrival, check-in at hotel. Overnight in Mu Cang Chai.

07-Mar-26: Mu Cang Chai (B/-/-)

After breakfast, transfer to a village located at over 1250 m altitude and inhabited by Hmong hill tribe group. This is the start of a 7 km trek to reach 'Mam Xoi hill', an iconic site where rice terraces shaped over centuries can be seen. Also visit a Hmong Village to meet the locals. Many still wear traditional dress and live in humble wooden houses whilst living and working off the land.

Return to the hotel by noon. Rest of the day and evening at leisure. Overnight in Mu Cang Chai.

08-Mar-26: Mu Cang Chai (B/-/-)

All day at leisure.

Ask your guide for some programm activities which you can do either on your own or book through your guide. If additional charge occurs you can either pay it through an eMail link from our local agent or directly to the guide.

Overnight in Mu Cang Chai.

09-Mar-26: Mu Cang Chai – Sapa (B/-/-)

Today drive to Sa Pa.

Note: long driving for 5-6 hours. The roads are also very curvy.

Overnight in Sapa.

10-Mar-26: Sapa – Excursion to Fansipan – Love Waterfall – Heaven's Gate (B/-/-)

Fansipan is in the Hoang Lien Son range which holds the status of a nature reserve. The cable car ride takes around 15 minutes and offers stunning mountain and valley views. From the top station, visitors can either take a short funicular train or climb about 600 steps to reach the actual summit.

The trip continues with a car ride to Silver Waterfall where you can enjoy the stunning mountain vista and the lush plant life of Hoang Lien National Park. After spending some time at Silver Waterfall, the drive will continue for a few more kilometres to the gate of Hoang Lien National Park, where a short walk through jungle will bring you to Love Waterfall. The area is dense with trees and tropical plants and clear water cascades down the rocky mountainside. You'll have time to relax here, listening to the sound of the waterfall and dipping your feet into the cool water to relax.

Leaving the waterfall, you'll head back to your vehicle before taking a short drive to visit Heaven's Gate – the highest pass in Vietnam. From a height of 2000 m above sea level, you'll be treated to sweeping views of the majestic mountains and deep valleys below. The trip will end with a drive back to Sapa town.

Overnight in Sapa.

11-Mar-26: Sapa - Half day "Off the beaten track" Matra – Ta Phin (B/-/-)

Your ride will be mostly downhill through villages surrounding Sapa. Leaving Sapa town, you'll head downhill to Ma Tra village, home to a Black H'mong community. You'll have the chance to stop along the way to take photos and visit some local houses.

The Black H'mong are the majority group living in Sapa, and are known for their intricate embroidery. You will continue along a quiet road leading to a beautiful valley then head to Ta Phin. Here you will have time to take a short walk around to explore the village and learn more about the culture of the Red Dao people.

After exploring the village, you will get in the car for the journey back to Sapa.

Overnight in Sapa.

Grade: Moderate

Approx: 11.8 km biking / 2.5 hours / 20 minutes walking / 30 minutes driving.

Note: There will be no support car during the bike tour.

12-Mar-26: Sapa (B/-/-)

All day at leisure.

Overnight in Sapa.

13-Mar-26: Sapa Hidden's Trails (B/L/-)

The tour will start with a transfer deeper into Hoang Lien National Park to the starting point for trekking near Sin Chai village, which lies off the beaten tourist track. Here you will be treated to stunning views of high mountains and deep valleys.

The trails will soon lead you to the Red Dao village of Nam Nhiu, where you will meet the villagers, visit their homes, and learn about their daily life working predominantly as farmers.

Leaving the village behind, you will turn into a small dirt trail leading into a valley dotted with bamboo huts, which are used by local farmers as overnight lodges during the harvest season. After passing rice terraces and a river you will walk on a quiet road for a while before arriving at Nam Cang village.

Nam Cang village lies at the far end of Sapa valley, and the Red Dao women who live in the village wear some of the most colorful and diverse clothing of all Vietnam's ethnic groups. They are famous for their herbal bath preparations, local medicine and embroidery. Accompanied by your guide, you can explore the village and learn how the local villagers make writing paper, silver jewelry and colorful embroidery.

Have lunch at a local restaurant before meeting your vehicle for the journey back.

Overnight in Sapa.

Grade: Moderate

Approx: 8.6km walking/ 3 - 3.5 hours; 2.5 hour-driving; 1 hour for lunch.

Distance of transfer (to/back): 29 km / 36 km

14-Mar-26: Sapa – Lao Cai Saturday Market – Hanoi (B/-/-)

Today heading to Lao Cai in the early morning to visit Can Cau market. The road is relatively flat from Lao Cai to Bao Nhai bridge. After crossing the bridge, we begin our journey uphill offering beautiful views over the valleys. Situated 20 km from Bac Ha, Can Cau is a small, but very colorful market.

Opening only on Saturdays, it always delivers a very photogenic display of Flower Hmong, Black Zao, Phu La ethnic costumes.

After the market visit, returning to Hanoi. Overnight in Hanoi.

Driving distance: approx. 5 hours for 285 km

15-Mar-26: Hanoi Rural Life By Bicycle (B/-/-)

Today's tour will begin at 08:00 h and last until approx. 13.00 h. Leave the hustle and bustle of the city behind to experience cycling in the Hanoi countryside. After a safety briefing and bike fitting, start pedaling through the small back alleys of Bac Bien Village. Arrive at the banks of the Duong River and board a local ferry for a short crossing, enjoying the scenes as the boat glides across the water.

Back on the bikes, pedal parallel to the river then turn into quaint villages. This presents the perfect opportunity to discover traditional local houses, ancient pagodas and temples, lively markets and gardens. Stop often for photos or simply to enjoy the atmosphere of authentic Vietnamese country life. Pay a visit to a local family for sipping tea and gain insights into their daily life.

Following this insightful bike ride through Hanoi's outskirts, pedal back into town and return to the hotel for a chance to freshen up.

Overnight in Hanoi.

Responsible Travel: Traveling by bicycle is an eco-friendly, emissions-free way to sightsee.
